

- For example, the accounting department has a course (06A:190), which allows students to receive 3 credit hours for a paid internship. There is little stringent faculty oversight of this course. Because of concerns over students simultaneously getting course credit and money as well as concerns about faculty oversight, the department is inclined to drop 06A:190. However, the department does want to promote experiential learning in concert with the strategic plan.
- University students can also get university credit (not business-college credit) for a paid internship with the Des Moines Center Internship Program, which is run by the Pomerantz Career Center.
- Forrest commented that the economics department has had a course in which students can get credit for interning, but the course has been hard to implement. One issue is that each student in the course needs a faculty advisor, but faculty get no additional credit for taking on such a responsibility.
- Sam commented that the College of Engineering may have similar issues with its co-op program.
- **The committee decided to revisit the issue at the next meeting, when David Baumgartner (Career Services), Lon Moeller (UPO), and Bruce Johnson (Accounting) will be invited to attend to provide more information.**
